Depot District Project Area

In 2008, the RDA finalized the purchase of the Rio Grande Hotel at 428 West 300 South. The RDA funded repairs to the historic hotel, and engaged a private operator to provide 49 weekly rental Single Room Occupancy units for low-income individuals. The hotel has been full since it opened, and there are approximately 75 people on the waiting list at any given time.

NORTH TEMPLE VIADUCT CDA

North Temple Viaduct Community Development Area (CDA)

The North Temple Viaduct Community Development Area (NT CDA) was created in January 2010 for the purpose of funding a portion of the costs associated with rebuilding and shortening the North Temple viaduct. The new bridge will accommodate construction of the Airport Light Rail Line as well as a transfer station for the Front Runner commuter rail service.





UTAH THEATER (144 S MAIN ST)



UTAH PERFORMING ARTS CENTER (UPAC - 115 S MAIN ST)

Central Business District Project Area

In 2008, Mayor Ralph Becker announced plans to develop the Utah Performing Arts Center in downtown Salt Lake City. This facility will provide a 2400-seat theater suitable for touring Broadway productions, as well as support facilities for the theater, and other mixed-use components. The RDA led the effort to evaluate potential sites, and entered an exclusive negotiation agreement with property owners to purchase key parcels between Regent Street and Main Street. The RDA has engaged a development team to determine how the theater will best fit on Block 70 and evaluate the feasibility of the project. The Utah Performing Arts Center will provide greatly expanded capacity for touring Broadway shows, and will build arts patronage and business activity in downtown Salt Lake City.

GALLIVAN CENTER RENOVATION: (50 E 200 S) Central Business District Project Area During the 1990s, the RDA constructed the John W. Gallivan Utah Center (Gallivan Center). Located at 50 East 200 South, the Gallivan Center is an outdoor gathering place and event venue for Salt Lake City residents and visitors, housing a concert stage, a large grassy plaza, and ice skating rink with a variety of programmable spaces for public and private

> The RDA is renovating the plaza by expanding the amphitheater to accommodate larger concerts and increasing the size of the skating rink for winter use. The RDA hired EDA Architects to provide architectural and engineering services for the project, and Big-D Construction to act as the general contractor. The new amphitheater will be more than twice the size of the original amphitheater, and the larger skating rink is now relocated to the east side of the plaza. A new building on 200 South will house permanent restroom facilities, skate rental services, and a maintenance area on the first floor, and a banquet hall on the second floor. The project also includes repair and replacement of leaking expansion joints and the drainage system. The new skating rink was finished in November 2010 and was open for the 2010-2011 holiday season. The grand re-opening of the renovated Gallivan Center occurred Summer 2011.

ARDMORE PLACE RECONSTRUCTION (APPROX 360 N FROM 200-300 WEST) West Capitol Hill Project Area

The RDA funded the reconstruction of Ardmore Place, from 200 to 300 West, in the West Capitol Hill Project Area. The project included the removal and replacement of street pavement, as well as installation of curb, gutters, sidewalks, drive approaches, street lighting, storm drainage, and related streetscape amenities. Ardmore Place is a narrow, 20-foot wide street that was in poor condition and lacked the necessary improvements to support the surrounding housing units. The project meets the RDA's goal of improving the streetscape environment and addresses the Capitol Hill Master Plan, which calls for the improvement of the street.
